

Money At A Glance

Residency

- Self Sufficiency Income of 1,200 Euro a month (excluding rent)
- Golden Visa (Real Estate) Investment of 500,000 Euro or more
- Non Habitual Residency program 0% tax on eligible foreign income



Access at A Glance

Ease of Access and Connections

- Direct Flights from East Coast of North America
- Low Cost Airlines within Europe
- Good intercity Train System
- Good national road network but beware the tolls!
- 90% of the country has good internet provision

Lifestyle

- LIOS Number 1 retirement choice for the last seven years
- Easy access to Europe
- Excellent property investment opportunities
- Great weather over 300 days of sunshine a year
- Fabulous local fresh food (especially fish), local wines and dining



Watch out for...

- Bureaucracy—lots of red tape—especially in real estate development
- High taxes for working people and low average wage
- Cars, fuel, electronics and tolls are expensive
- Portuguese is a difficult language (practice made more difficult as most people speak English)





Carvoeiro Pros

- A town that has everything you could need for a holiday right on your doorstep
- Lots of great shops and restaurants
- Lovely cliff walks and hidden beaches
- Great location for holiday rental properties



Carvoeiro Cons

- The main beach is quite small and gets packed in the summer
- Most of the holiday accommodation is located on the very edge of town, it's quite a long walk into town
- It is a very busy place in the summer months





Ferragudo Pros

- One of the most photographed places in the Algarve,
 this is a stunningly pretty village
- Wide selection of dining options including excellent fresh seafood restaurants
- The main beaches are long with soft sand and beautiful views



Ferragudo Cons

- House prices here have risen sharply
- A lot of restaurants shut from November to the end of March
- You will need your own transport if you are based here but want to explore further



Alvor Pros

- The main waterfront area has lovely fish restaurants and cafés
- The boardwalk leading down to the wide-open beaches is a great place to walk
- The town has everything you could need, most of it is within walking distance

Alvor Cons

- Outside of the main town there are a lot of modern (ugly) apartment blocks and complexes
- Nightlife can be noisy during the summer months
- Lack of variety for shopping lots of similar 'tourist' shops selling cheap merchandise









Lagos Pros

- A busy and bustling town, with lots of shops, a hospital, historical buildings and good infrastructure
- Easy transport links to other parts of the Algarve
- Good expat community
- Doesn't close down in the winter months



Lagos Cons

- For some people, this is just too big and busy; and they prefer somewhere quieter
- The town has a large urban sprawl, it's easy to get lost if you don't know where you are going
- The further west you go, the more susceptible you are to the prevailing winds and colder weather
